

Peer Support Specialist Connections

The Peer Support Specialist provides peer support, information, and advocacy to individuals diagnosed with a serious and persistent mental illness living or a substance use disorder, in order to assist them in regaining control over their own lives and recovery process, and integrating into the community. Facilitates groups, activities, trainings, and workshops. Assists clients in articulating goals for recovery and determining the objectives needed to reach their goals, as well as assisting clients in obtaining community supports that tie in to their recovery goals. Position requires frequent transportation of clients within company vehicles.

Minimum Qualifications:

Candidates must be a past or present consumer of mental health and/or chemical addiction services who can relate to others who are currently using those services. Able to share personal experience and encourage wellness and recovery. High School or GED required. Preferred to have some type of peer training from a community agency. NYS motor vehicle license, safe driving record required.

Part-time, 15 hours: Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday 9:00 AM- 2:00 PM.

Wage and Benefits:

Hourly rate will be determined based on the candidate's education and experience. This position is only eligible for statutory benefits
