

Supports During the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19 Pandemic

COVID-19 is “a mild to severe respiratory illness that is caused by a coronavirus,” one that is characterized especially by fever, cough, and shortness of breath and may progress to pneumonia and respiratory failure. The name is an odd sort of acronym, insofar as it is formed from portions of two distinct words (COronaVIrus & Disease) and the latter portion of a date (the 19 from 2019). COVID-19 was first identified in Wuhan, China in December 2019.

Isolation: What you do when you are sick and do not want to infect anyone else.

Quarantine: What you do when you are directly exposed but not sick and do not want to infect anyone else in care you get sick.

Social Distancing: What we do to collectively reduce the risk of transmission and the rate of spread in the population, so we can protect vulnerable people and try to avoid the health care system becoming overwhelmed.

Bottom Line: These three populations can have contact WITHIN them but NOT be mixed! Do not put someone in isolation for symptoms and/or positive test in same room as someone quarantined!

- St. Luke’s and St. Elizabeth have testing sites (MVHS), also Rome Hospital.
- First, contact your Primary, explain your symptoms. Your doctor will provide you with a script for a testing site. If your Primary does not suspect COVID-19 as the

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culprit of your illness, they will not send you for unnecessary testing. You would call back if your symptoms were to change.

- St. Elizabeth has a tent outside for anyone without a Primary. You would contact the ER (Emergency Room) of the test location closest to you and schedule a time for testing.
- *This was not confirmed*, but MVHS East Utica Medical Office will be testing anyone without a Primary.
- Notification of test results vary based on when and where the test was completed.

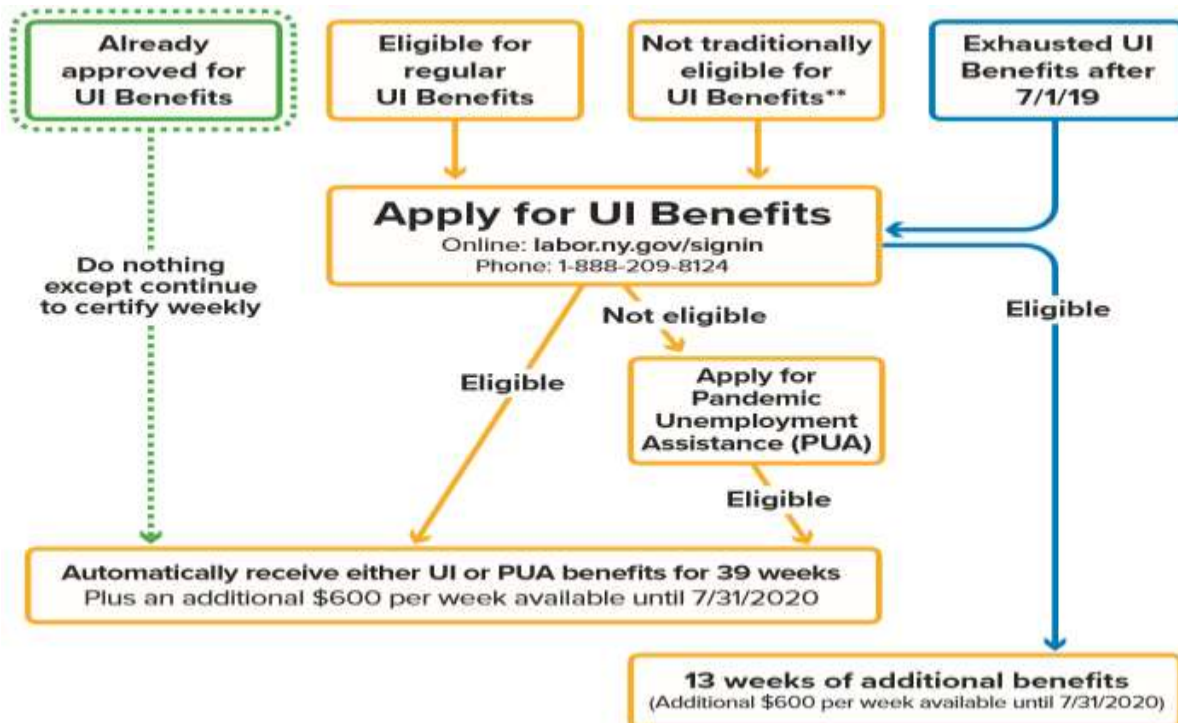

The federal CARES Act was signed into law March 27, 2020. The Act provides enhanced Unemployment Insurance (UI) benefits and Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) for New Yorkers. Here's what you need to know.

Stimulus Check Information and Resources

- Important notice: your stimulus check will likely be direct deposited into your bank account or sent to your address, as indicated on the last tax return you submitted. If your address has changed, you can submit a Change of Address form: <https://www.irs.gov/pub/irs-pdf/f8822.pdf>. According to the IRS, the Treasury plans to develop a web-based portal for individuals to provide their banking information to the IRS online so that individuals can receive payments immediately.

Supplemental Security Income (SSI)

Individuals who are receiving SSI need to be aware of several key elements related to the stimulus payment:

- 1.) Stimulus payments are NOT taxable.
- 2.) Stimulus payments received by the individual that are initiated through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) will not count as income in the calculation of the individual's SSI amount for the month (26 U.S. Code 6409)
- 3.) Stimulus payments will not be counted as "resources" for a twelve-month period following the receipt of the funds (26 U.S. 6409).

Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI), Disabled Widow(er) Benefits (DWB), Childhood Disability Benefits (CDB)

The Stimulus payments will have no impact on any of these Title II benefits: SSDI, DWB, CDB, and SSA Retirement. These benefits are classified as insurance benefits and are NOT impacted by unearned income. In addition, the stimulus payments will NOT be taxable.

Please note that Title II benefits are SSA benefits. SSI benefits are federal welfare benefits. At any time when the Act refers to "Social Security Benefits", "SSI" is not included unless specifically stated by the statute.

CENTRO TO TEMPORARILY WAIVE BUS FARES

EFFECTIVE: Tuesday, March 24, 2020


Syracuse, NY – Effective Tuesday March 24, 2020, Centro will temporarily waive the requirement to pay a fare for bus services in all locations until further notice. This includes Call-A-Bus services.

In addition, on all of its buses with rear doors, Centro will require passengers to enter and exit through the rear doors. Exceptions will be made for individuals who request the bus kneel in order to board, or for persons using mobility devices.

The indoor waiting areas at Centro's transit hubs in Syracuse and Utica are also closed until further notice. Outside seating is still available, and Centro supervisors will still be on site at both locations to assist customers.

In compliance with Governor Cuomo's directive to reduce all non-essential personnel, Centro's Call Center will not be staffed until further notice. Customers with service-related questions can still use Centro's automated system by calling (315) 442-3400 to get next bus information. Customers will need to know their Bus Stop ID number in order to use this system.
